01865 208290. If you have lived experience of abuse from within the Church of England, you may prefer to call the dedicated telephone NSPCC helpline, which is independent of the Church. Call 0800 802020.

- **2. Coronavirus:** The UK Government has assessed the risk from Coronavirus as "moderate". The Church of England therefore advises that those parishioners who are coughing or sneezing do not to shake hands at The Peace. In line with further Church of England advice, the priest and single chalice server will thoroughly wash their hands before administering and the priest will dip the communicants wafer into the wine, carried by the chalice server and then place the dipped wafer into the communicants hand as "the Body and Blood of Christ".
- **3. New LGBTI+ Chaplaincy:** This has been set up to support LGBTI+ people over 18 who live in the Diocese, their families and friends, clergy and pastoral leaders. Visit oxford.anglican.lgbt to find out more and hear from the Chaplains.

Welcome to today's Service. At St Nicolas, pending the replacement of our heating system, we have temporary heaters: Parents and carers are asked to keep children away from these gas heaters on both sides of our church.

**Collect (or Prayer for Today)** 

Almighty Father, whose Son was revealed in majesty before he suffered death upon the cross: give us grace to perceive his glory, that we may be strengthened to suffer with him and be changed into his likeness, from glory to glory; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading: 2 Peter 1:16-21 Eyewitnesses of Christ's Glory

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

The Gospel: Matthew 17: 1-9 The Transfiguration

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was

transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them. saying, "Get up and do not be



afraid." And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone. As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."
